

Eight Promises of Grace & Three Truths

God's family, here at St. John's, lives out the vision and mission by seeking relationships through a life of discipleship and following eight promises of grace, knowing that following these promises can only happen because of the strength God gives us through His Word and Sacrament, trusting in His hope and forgiveness when we fall short.

- 1. Joyfully celebrate the gifts of forgiveness of sins and eternal life, which God gave us in our baptism,
- Openly proclaim to others our God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as expressed in the words of the Apostles' Creed,
- 3. Be steadfast in prayer,
- 4. Daily oppose the devil and all sinful influences around us and from within us,
- 5. Be loyal to our church family and her teachings,
- 6. Declare the Scriptures to be the inerrant, inspired Word of God,
- Ongoing spiritual growth through regular/faithful worship, reception of Holy Communion, and Bible Study.
- 8. Serve our Lord with the time, talents, and resources He gives us within our church family and within His church at large.

We celebrate our identity within the Holy Christian Church as Lutheran Christians. Care Ministries

<u>Card Ministry</u>: Our card ministry meets on the second Saturday of the month from 9:00-11:00 AM in the nursery room. Each year they make several hundred handmade cards for members of St. John's who are sick, hospitalized, celebrating anniversaries and baptisms, in military service, or shut-in. If you have an artistic flare and would like to join the card ministry, contact Pam Muther at (262) 338-9435.

<u>Care & Share</u>: Our care and share ministry provides assistance to members and non-members throughout our community who are in need of assistance. The assistance we are able to provide varies according to need and the availability of resources. You can support this ministry by bringing non-perishable food items to the church to help restock our food pantry or by providing financial assistance. If you would like to support this ministry or are in need of assistance, please contact Pastor David at (262) 334-4901 ext. 304.

<u>Counseling</u>: St. John's helps provide support for those who are in need of professional counsel through the services of Deb Graf, a licensed professional counselor and member of St. John's. While we do not provide for on-going counseling, we will assist people in locating professional care. For more information contact Pastor David at (262) 334-4901 ext.304.

<u>Hospital Visitation:</u> St. John's provides regular visits to our members who are hospitalized. Our team of pastors and lay leaders are scheduled to provide daily visits to those at St. Joe's in West Bend. Our team also schedules visits for those who are hospitalized elsewhere. Ladies Aid: The Ladies Aid actively serves by providing meals for families following funeral services. This service group meets on the first Thursday of each month from 11:00 AM–2:00 PM in the lower level fellowship hall for a time of food, fellowship, devotional time, and a variety of activities. LWML: St. John's has an active Lutheran Women's Missionary League group that meets on the second Monday of the month in the church's lower level fellowship hall. Children's Ministries

Connections Ministry

Education Ministries—Early Childhood Center

Our devoted staff is committed to the growth and development of young children and seeks to provide an environment that promotes Christian values and spiritual growth. Serving alongside parents, together we are raising the children of our future. We entered into the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program for our K4 programs in 2019 and are accredited by National Lutheran School Accreditation. We hope that you will visit us and see all we have to offer. Our staff looks forward to meeting you and having the opportunity and privilege to care for your child.

<u>Infants & Toddlers:</u> An environment that provides loving and individualized care that includes physical, emotional, social, and fine motor skills development. Infants and toddlers will also engage in gross-motor and outdoor activities.

Pre K3 & Pre K4: Scheduled programming including Jesus time, group activities and projects, letter and number recognition, development of writing skills, gym time (physical development), and creative free time. Life Groups

Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry - Christ-Centered Care for God's People

Stephen Ministry is a nation-wide care ministry that has been in place at St. John's for over twenty years as another way to live out our mission of *Connecting, Caring, and Sharing in Christ*, with an emphasis on person-toperson care for those in need.

Throughout the Bible, the importance of sharing faith and life <u>together</u> is an oft-repeated thread. God's people are called to share one another's burdens (Gal 6:2), and to gather together in Christ (Matt 18:20). Care Ministry at St. John's is founded on Christ's call to love and serve one another, and Stephen Ministry aids our church in that mission.

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a lay-led, service life group that works under the oversight of Care Ministry. It trains Stephen Ministers, who are paired with care receivers after receiving fifty hours of training. A Stephen Minister might spend anywhere from two months to two years meeting weekly with you after you've moved, changed careers, welcomed a new baby into the family, said goodbye to a love one, or experienced another big life change – all depending on your need. It's for the young man feeling lost after graduating high school; it's for the woman who's been coming to church for the last seventy years of her life and is wondering if she still has a place, and it's for many more, besides.

Stewardship Ministry

The LCMS defines stewardship as, "the free and joyous activity of the child of God, and God's family, the church, in managing all of life and life's resources for God's purpose." At St. John's, we take stewardship seriously. Stewardship is more than just turning in an offering envelope when we attend worship. As we live out our lives as disciples, who are called by and follow Christ, our actions and thoughts are in line with stewardship. Stewardship is Discipleship and Discipleship is Stewardship. You cannot have one without the other

However, it is hard to "manage all of life and life's resources for God's purpose." In fact, some may ask, what does this even mean? Are we living within our means or spending constantly with no budget to keep you in check? Have we created a will for our self, spouse, and family, or is that something we are going to let the legal system decide? What about when we are experiencing a financial crisis. . . Who do you turn to? How do you navigate the road ahead? These are great questions to wrestle with because this begins to help us understand how large this stewardship conversation really is. Estate Planning/Partnership with St. John's Foundation: The Stewardship Office works to educate and walk alongside families to develop a Lifetime Stewardship Plan. We engage in conversations to help plan and establish a budget, a Christian Will/Trust, legal guardians, power of attorney, Family Blessing/Preamble, and provide counsel to protect and bless family and ministry with assets. These conversations help to prepare you when you sit down and meet with an attorney and/or your financial advisor. If you would like more information or just have some general questions regarding Stewardship, you are encouraged to speak with Pastor Jeff Hesse.

Financial Crisis Intervention:

Trained staff and volunteers at St. John's work with families to evaluate current financial situations and identify practical ways to manage God's resources, establish a budget, connect to other St. John's ministries, refer to community resources, etc. We also have a confidential "Care and Share" fund which has been established to help members with emergency needs. All conversations are confidential.

Financial Education through Financial Peace University:

Trained staff and volunteers hold individual meetings and host educational opportunities through Financial Peace University, to assist in managing God's resources.
